## ORDINANCE # 106

ORDINANCE WHICH RELATES TO COLLECTION AND RECYCLING OF MATERIALS AS RECOMMENDED BY THE STATE OF WISCONSIN.

- 1. The effective date of this ordinance shall be January 1, 1995.
- 2. All materials which are to be recycled must be cleaned and free of contaminates prior to being recycled.
- 3. All occupants of the community; including occupants of single family residences, 2 to 4 unit residences, multiple-family (5 units or more) dwellings, non-residential facilities, businesses and all properties will be responsible for separated recyclable materials from ordinary garbage.
  - 4. Recyclable materials will be defined as follows:
    - a. Lead acid batteries
    - b. Major appliances
    - c. Waste oil
    - d. Yard waste
    - e. Aluminum containers
    - f. Bi-metal & metal containers
    - g. Glass containers
    - h. Newspapers
    - i. Corrugated paper
    - j. Waste tires
    - k. Plastic containers #1 & #2

Other materials will be classified as recyclable materials at the time that the recycling center will accept them. They are defined as follows:

- 1. Magazines
- m. Office paper
- n. Foam Packaging
- o. Plastic containers #3 #4 #5 #6 #7
- 5. Provision will be in place by January 1, 1995 to provide for the collection, preparation and distribution of all recyclable materials.
- 6. All citizens of the community will be informed as to their responsibilities for properly separating recyclable materials from ordinary garbage.
- 7. Those citizens who fail to comply with the recycling ordinance will be issued a citation and penalized as provided for under Sections 159.95 and 159.97 of the Wisconsin Statutes.
- 8. This ordinance shall take effect from and after passage and publication.
