

AN ORDINANCE PROMOTING PUBLIC PEACE, ORDER AND GENERAL WELFARE IN THE VILLAGE OF DORCHESTER, CLARK COUNTY, WISCONSIN.

The Village Board of the Village of Dorchester, being duly assembled do, on the 2 day of July, 1957, ordain as follows:

The statutory provisions describing and defining regulations with respect to crimes against public, peace, order and general welfare, under Chapter 947 of the Wisconsin Statutes, laws of 1955, are hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this ordinance of the Village of Dorchester, Clark County, Wisconsin, with the same force and effect as though set forth herein verbatim, to wit, Chapter 947, Sections 947.01 (defining disorderly conduct and providing penalties for violation thereof), Section 947.02 (defining vagrancy and establishing penalties therefore), Section 947.03 (defining drunkenness and providing penalties therefore), and Section 947.06 (defining unlawful assembly and their suppression, and establishing penalties therefore), is hereby adopted and by reference made a part of the Village of Dorchester ordinances, and shall be known as Village of Dorchester Ordinance Number 102, and the subsections thereunder shall correspond to the subsections set forth in Chapter 947 as they apply hereto, except that no jail sentence shall be imposed except in default of payment of a forfeiture imposed by the court.

Be It Resolved that Justices of the Peace of the Village of Dorchester may charge such court costs and other legal disbursements in the administration of this ordinance as provided by Statutes of the State of Wisconsin for courts of Justices of the Peace.

This ordinance shall be in force and effect upon and after its adoption and publication as provided by law.

Adopted at a regular monthly meeting of the Village of Dorchester on the 2 day of July, 1957.

Trustee Kraeger moved that the Ordinance be adopted. UNANIMOUS NOTE 5 ayes, no naves. Motion Carried.
