

ORDINANCE No. 106

An Ordinance regulating the parking upon the streets of the Village of Dorchester, during the hours of 2:00 o'clock A. M., to 7:00 o'clock A. M.

The Village Board of the Village of Dorchester, do ordain, as follows:

Section 1:

In order to protect and promote the public health, morals, and general welfare of the community, and to lessen congestion on the streets, to secure safety for fire, panic, and other dangers, to provide adequate light and air, to prevent the overcrowding of streets, to avoid undue concentration of population, and to facilitate adequate provisions for maintenance of the streets of the Village of Dorchester, all pursuant to Section 349.13 Wis. Statutes, no person shall park any vehicle on any of the streets within the limits of the Village of Dorchester, between the hours of 2:00 o'clock A. M., and 7:00 o'clock A. M., EXCEPT:

- (a). If a vehicle becomes disabled while on the streets, in such a manner or to such an extent that it is impossible to avoid stopping or temporarily leaving the vehicle parked on the said streets; or the stopping of the vehicle is necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic, or to comply with traffic regulations, or the directions of a traffic officer or traffic control, sign, or signal; or a vehicle bearing a special registration plate issued to a disabled war veteran may be so parked, and the said parking privilege granted hereunder by this subsection ~~is~~ limited to the person to whom the special plate was issued and to qualified operators acting under his express direction with the disabled veteran present.

Section 2:

Wherever any traffic officer finds a vehicle standing upon the streets of the Village of Dorchester, in violation of this ordinance, he is authorized to move such vehicle or to require the operator in charge thereof to move such vehicle to a position where parking is not prohibited.

Section 3:

Any person, firm, trust, partnership, association or corporation who fails to comply with any provision of this ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof, forfeit not less than \$10, nor more than \$100, together with the costs of prosecution for each violation, and in default of payment thereof, shall be imprisoned in the county jail of Clark County, Wisconsin, until payment of such forfeiture and costs, but not exceeding thirty days. In addition, if it is necessary for a traffic officer to remove a vehicle parked in violation of this ordinance, then the said violator shall pay a reasonable sum for the moving of the said vehicle, and the storage of the same, if that is necessary, in addition to the foregoing forfeiture and costs. These expenses are to be added to the foregoing forfeiture and costs, and to be considered a part thereof.

This ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage and publication.


