## ORDINANCE IN REGARD TO DISORDERLY CONDUCT

The Village Board of the Village of Dorchester, Clark County, Wisconsin does hereby ordain as follows:

That Ordinance # 141, the original ordinance in regard to disorderly conduct be amended as follows:

## Section 1.

- a. No person shall in a public or private place, engage in violent, abusive, indecent, profane, boisterous, unreasonably loud or otherwise disorderly conduct under circumstances in which such conduct tends to cause or provoke a disturbance, or,
- b. No person shall make a telephone call, with intent to annoy another, whether or not conversation ensues, or,
- c. No person shall, within the Village of Dorchester, on public or private property, by or through the use of a motor vehicle, motorcycle, snowmobile or mini-bike, under circumstances which tend to cause or provoke a disturbance or annoy one or more persons, engage in violent abusive, unreasonably loud or otherwise disorderly conduct, including but not limited to unnecessary or deliberate or intentional: Spinning of wheels, squealing of tires; revving of the engine; blowing the horn (s); causing the engine to backfire; or causing the vehicle, while commencing to move or in motion, to raise one or more of its wheels off the ground. Such conduct is declared to be both unlawful and a nuisance.

## Section 2.

Any person who shall violate the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$200.00, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment thereof, by imprisonment in the county jail for Clark County, Wisconsin for a period not exceeding 30 days.

This ordinance amendment shall be in effect from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.
